#### Situational English Level I

## **ABSTRACT**

Situational English Level I is a pioneering book in teaching English language skills and tools. It has 12 chapters that are authored and organized based on the situational and gradation principles covering the four skills of English language along with its tools of grammar and vocabulary. Each chapter consists of a reading passage that highlights one of the human thematically related activities such traveling, hunting, and having adventures. This reading passage is supported by multi-tiered linear and nonlinear comprehension questions that examine learners' reading and analytical skills as they are linked to their own experiences and lives. Moreover, each chapter has a situational dialogue that engages students in a lifelike conversation such as visiting a dentist or a stationery store aiming at enriching students' lexical competences. All the reading and conversational tasks are scaffolded by listening tasks that acquaint students with the native English language dialects and comprehension by asking some listening oriented questions. Furthermore, this book supports students syntactically by demonstrating the basic rules of forming sentences, the structure and the formation of the basic tenses as well as using time and place prepositions. Additionally, general and academic lexemes (vocabulary) are presented in many ways as learners are supposed to fill in the blanks with the most appropriate lexical items and use others in meaningful contexts. Briefly, this book is a practical teaching textbook and guide for teaching English language since it responds to students' personal needs and teaches them gradually how to listen, read, speak, and write in English practically.


