A Syrian Farewell Letter 1

Throughout this book, we will be referring back to the parts of this letter shown in red as the standard text to compare the various languages and dialects discussed. This letter was found in the pocket of a Syrian refugee who drowned in the Mediterranean Sea. He was aboard a ship carrying hundreds of Syrians, fleeing death and persecution by the Assad regime, and hoping to reach the European shores. As the weather conditions got more turbulent, it became clear to the author of the letter that they wouldn't survive. He used the last few minutes of his life to write this letter. He wrote the letter in Modern Standard Arabic (MSA)

April 23rd, 2015

Original Text (in MSA)

"أنا آسف يا أمي لأن السفينة غرقت بنا ولم أستطع الوصول إلى هناك (أوروبا)، كما لن أتمكن من إرسال المبالغ التي استدنتها لكي أدفع أجر الرحلة.

لا تحزني يا أمي إن لم يجدوا جثتي، فماذا ستفيدك الآن إلا تكاليف نقل وشحن ودفن وعزاء.

أنا آسف يا أمي لأن الحرب حلّت، وكان لا بد لي أن أسافر كغيري من البشر، مع العلم أن أحلامي لم تكن كبيرة كالآخرين، كما تعلمين كل أحلامي كانت بحجم علبة دواء للكولون لك، وثمن تصليح أسنانك.
