Preface

Western Neo-Aramaic is the last surviving branch of the Western Aramaic dialects. With only a few thousand speakers left in Syria, it faces a serious risk of extinction. For this reason, extensive efforts are needed to document and preserve the language. This book explores various aspects of the WNA language as spoken in the village of Jubaadin. The pronunciation of each WNA word is written using Latin letters, Arabic letters, and a modified version of the Syriac alphabet. The grammar of Modern Standard Arabic is used as a model to structure the grammar of Western Neo-Aramaic. Grammatical notes and explanations are written in both English and Arabic. This book also includes stories, texts, and poems written by native speakers of the language.

This work could not have been completed without the help and assistance of several people. Mohammad Zaid Alloush dedicated countless hours of his time to help me further understand the grammar and syntax of the WNA language as well as helped with the editing and translation of the texts. Fawzi Silan, Ali Alloush, Ahmad Ammoush, Mohammad Zaid Alloush, and others helped me gather and accumulate the dictionary entries at the end of the book. Several poets contributed their poems.
